Calder Jewelry-A Book Review

Calder Jewelry (Yale University Press - ISBN 978-0-300-13428-5) is currently my most coveted book. I purchased it at the Milwaukee Art Museum with some Christmas money and it is the very best present I've selected for myself yet! Published by the Calder Foundation, it contains remarks by Calder's grandson Alexander R.C. Rower and essays by Mark Rosenthal and Jane Adlin.

Alexander Calder (1898-1976) was a sculptor and jewelry artist whose wearable pieces repeat the linear, three-dimensional qualities of his mobiles and wire sculptures. He used found objects (my hero) and non-precious metals that he hammered, shaped and composed into very simple, honest forms. Calder never succumbed to many offers to edition his designs, preferring instead to create each piece as its own unique work.

The book's 288 pages are replete with remarkable photographs (by freelancer Maria Robledo) featuring select pieces from the more than 1800 pieces of Calder created in his lifetime. Calder's inventory drawings and even the boxes he made to transport and store his jewelry are also documented therein.

A beautiful coffee table book to many, this lovely compilation will continue to be housed on my bench where I can borrow inspiration at arm's length.
