Desert Rose Beaded Bead

When: Sunday, February 28, 1:30pm to 4:30pm

Where: Classroom at Mount Mary University, 2900 Menomonee River Pkwy, Milwaukee. Registered participants will be notified of exact classroom location prior to class.

Skill Level: Intermediate

Cost of Class: \$35, includes printed project instructions

Create a beaded bead with CzechMates two-hole lentils. These beaded beads suggest a type of mineral found in the Sahara Desert...hence their name, Desert Rose. Each bead is about one inch in diameter. They have an internal bead to prevent collapsing. The beaded beads are based on a dodecahedron shape. The beaded beads can be strung together for a stunning necklace.

Supplies for 1 beaded bead:

Supplies and/or Tools to bring to class:

- 30 CzechMates two-hole 6 mm lentils
- 60 seed beads, size 15
- 1 10 mm round bead for the center

- beading thread – Fireline, 6 lb., smoke
- beading needles – size 10
- microcrystalline wax
- scissors or thread cutter
- beading mat or work surface
- disposable lighter
- task light and extension cord, optional
- magnifiers, optional
